Things you must see in Gothenburg:

Universeum - The national science discovery centre

Museum of world culture - The museum interprets the concept of world culture in a dynamic and open-minded manner.

The museum of art - This museum has 3 stars in the Michelin Green Guide Scandinavia **The maritime centre** - Get onboard a destroyer or a submarine

Paddan - Sightseeing boats that show the beauty of Gothenburg from a waterside perspective. **Elfsborg's fortress** - The Paddan-boats can take you to this spectacular fortress, the key to the Gothenburg harbour.

The Botanic gardens - 430 acres of rare species and a vast arboretum. It has 3 stars in Guide Michelin.

Trädgårdsföreningen - They have 5 000 roses!

Liseberg - An amusement park where you easily could spend a couple of days!

Gunnebo House and Gardens - Has recieved the EU prize for cultural heritage / Europe Nostra Award

The Fish "Church"- This is the fish-market in a building looking more like a church. It was built in 1874.

The market hall - This hall, built in 1885, is one of few still in use in Sweden.

The Antique market - Built in the 1880:ies for a bank, this palace is now our antique-market with 30 different shops.
